

Phil Gravett	L	Dancing Common Cranes	In late March, early April 2022 the common crane migration peaked at an estimated 19,000 birds at Lake Hornborgas in Sweden. The local Swedish farmers scatter huge quantities of grain round the lake so that the birds do not feed on farmers' planted crops. The image illustrates the cranes' dancing behaviour – a form of bonding. I have chosen to highlight the two dancing cranes by greying out and lightening the many birds in the background. Also the image has been printed on art paper to give the photo more of a painterly look. For the technically minded: Canon EOS R6, Lens RF 100-500mm f/7.1 1/1000sec ISO- 1250 EV +1 at 500mm.	£50
